About Cameron Highlands

Cameron Highlands got its name from William Cameron, a British surveyor who stumbled across the plateau while mapping the area in 1885. It is currently one of Malaysia's most extensive hill resort destinations, and has an average temperature of between 15 and 24 degree Celsius. Boasting a lush terrain of tropical rainforests and fertile soil, Cameron Highlands is a key producer of fruits, vegetables and tea leaves in Malaysia. It has a total of nine districts, the more densely-populated areas being Ringlet, Tanah Rata, Brinchang and Kea Farm.

Transportation

Cameron Highlands is about 300km from Kuala Lumpur and it takes about 3 hours to get here via the North-South Expressway. Driving from Kuala Lumpur, proceed north until you reach Tapah. Exit, turn left at the traffic lights and from there drive onwards up a long winding road to Cameron Highlands. Alternatively, you can drive along the Simpang Pulai Road near lpoh, where the journey is smoother and shorter.

For non-driving travelers who intend to stay at the Strawberry Park Resort, you may take the ETS train from KL Sentral and get down at the lpoh Station – a journey that takes approximately 2 hour 20 min and costs about RM30.00. From lpoh Station, you can arrange for resort vehicles to drive you to your destination.

Accommodation / Attractions
